

CHILD PROTECTION CODE OF CONDUCT

ALWAYS:

- 1. Listen to and respect children, empower them and let them participate in planning and delivering activities as much as possible
- 2. Be aware of situations which may present risks for children and take appropriate actions
- 3. As far as possible, be visible while doing educational activities when working with children.
- 4. Consider your physical appearance at work. Adults working with children should dress appropriately for the task undertaken
- 5. Report any concerns related to the protection of children to the child protection focal person, child club representatives or Principal.
- 6. Implementing privacy, not doing matters of any situations of actual or suspected abuse that occurs except in accordance with this policy.
- 7. Preparing and implementing basic child protection list related to trip program while arranging or participating event or trip which involve children.
- 8. Inspiring teachers to use code of conduct as well as study materials related to child protection to stop abuse and develop positive classroom environment.
- 9. Coordinating with related authority and doing appropriate arrangement for children nutrition and vaccination.
- 10. Encouraging guardian for getting birth certificate of children.
- 11. Having appropriate, respectful and equal behavior with differently able children.
- 12. Encouraging all for school education according to the Nepal government mandatory policy.
- 13. Considering child friendly environment while exercising infrastructural developmental task.



NEVER:

- 1. Hit or otherwise physically assault or abuse children
- 2. Discriminating in the basis of cast, religion, family, community and gender.
- 3. Bullying, humiliating, dominating or calling with nickname to children.
- 4. Show differential treatment, or favor particular children to the exclusion of others.
- 5. Using language and gesture reflecting inappropriate, offensive, irritating, humiliating or abusive activities.
- 6. Spend excessive time alone with children away from others.
- 7. Develop relationships with children that could in any way be seen as exploitative or abusive.
- 8. Develop intimate sexual relationship with children.
- 9. Pay for sexual service, of any kind at any time, with anyone under the age of 18 years.
- 10. Expose children to pornographic materials in electronic or any other form.
- 11. Permit children to take part in activities that are illegal, unsafe or abusive.
- 12. Using alcohol, drugs and cigarette with children or ignoring transferring of such materials.
- 13. Behaving abusively while in the necessity of contacting through email, social media, mobile or other means with the children.
- 14. Let allegations go unreported including any made against them.
- 15. Agree to keep any information relating to the abuse of a child confidential.
- 16. Posting school activities in the social media permission without concern.
