

Role title: Experienced film producer

Location: Nepal, India and Bangladesh

Apply by: 14 December 2015

End date: 31 March 2016, with possibility for extension if programme continues

Background

English and digital skills are strongly connected to the labour market but the opportunities to develop and strengthen these skills in South Asia are limited, especially for adolescent girls. Girls and women have less access to education and ICTs, and less access to learning English than boys and men. This results in a gender digital divide which could lead to a serious skills imbalance and unequal life chances for girls and women in the future.

The British Council has initiated English and Digital for Girls' Education project (EDGE) in Nepal, India and Bangladesh to stimulate the educational opportunities and meet the needs of young girls in three countries. The project creates and provides easy access to education by offering English and digital education for adolescents at their doorstep through non-formal after school clubs. The long term goals of the EDGE project is "Adolescent girls from marginalised communities can make more informed and independent life choices, as is their right, in order to contribute more fully to the family, the economy and society."

The EDGE project is based on a similar British Council project implemented in Bangladesh. It showed that the girls gained confidence in both their English and ICT skills, more positive perceptions and attitudes towards English and ICT skills and more willingness to speak English. They were also observed to have become more vocal and ready to express opinions, which may indicate that the project also promoted female empowerment. The project also gained buy-in from parents and the local community. In addition, the peer leaders also developed observed leadership skills and began to talk about potential avenues for future income-generation as a result of their training and session delivery.

The project has been launched in Bangladesh since 2012 and it started in Nepal and India in 2015 having similar objectives and modality. The EDGE project aims to reach 2080 adolescent girls in Nepal 520 in India and 4264 in Bangladesh in 2015/16.

Project description

The EDGE project requires capturing the behaviour, skills and perception changes of the Peer Group Leaders, Adolescent Girls, master trainers, parents and other stakeholders in Nepal, India and Bangladesh as an evidence for the success, and improving future developments of the project. We currently hope to secure funding to continue EDGE in 2016/17.

In order to increase visibility of the British Council's work in the English education and allied skills sector, and ensure a legacy of the EDGE project intervention beyond the lifetime of the project in Nepal, India and Bangladesh, we are looking for a local partner organisation in Nepal which is well experience and has very good track record of the company's work in making high-quality educational and social documentary films.

Purpose of the Assignment

Objective of this assignment is to closely capture the behavior, skills and perception changes of Peer Group Leaders and Adolescent Girls involved in EDGE Nepal, India and Bangladesh and to produce:

- An hour edited film documentary in high definition following approximately 5 Peer Group Leaders and 3 Adolescent Girls of EDGE Nepal, EDGE India and EDGE Bangladesh.
- 20 minute promotional/advocacy film for each of the 3 countries highlighting the benefits of EDGE project.
- All documentaries are to be entertainment driven.

Approach:

Detailed interactions and discussions with the stakeholders, key informants, community
members, M&E team, parents, PGLs and club participants in the project activities. The
methodology of the filming should be participatory to ensure the effective participation and
consultation with the stakeholders and community to ensure wider ownership.

Activities

- 1. Discuss/interact with EDGE project team on the project program, plan, tools, methodology, concept, script etc.
- 2. Review all relevant project documents for reference/background information
- 3. Select characters for the documentary.
- 4. Conduct field visits to the assigned locations of each country and meet, and interact with project teams, implementing partners, trainers, Peer Group Leaders, club participants, parents, school teachers and community leaders.
- 5. Conduct relevant research in close coordination with the British Council, implementing agencies and other relevant stakeholders of each country.
- 6. Provide update reports to the British Council documenting activities that have taken place.
- 7. Hosts update meetings to show and discuss footage.
- 8. Complete of all documentaries to the British Council's satisfaction and aligned to British Council brand guidelines.

Some of the key things to consider

- Situation of the Peer Group Leaders and club participants before EDGE intervention
- Participants' involvement in club session and their learning outcomes
- Impact of the project in improvement of English, digital skills, 21st century skills on the Peer Group Leaders and club participants.

The number of days work required will be negotiated during the meeting with EDGE project team of Nepal.

Team composition

As the project is aimed at girls, we expect the proposed team to be balanced in terms of male to female ratio, and to include some female members.

Qualifications and experience required for experts put forward

- Experience of making high-quality educational and social documentary films
- Technical skills of staff (core film production and post-production teams)
- Core film production team should have valid passports and ability to travel between the three countries
- Very good Organisation and Management skills
- Fluent in written and spoken English

NB. We will not consider applications from individuals. Only organisations / institutions can apply. The documentary team is expected to be creative in terms of presentation and preference will be given to the team with new and innovative ideas.
